There are many reasons that youth become involved with substance abuse. One of the leading factors cited by youth is **Peer Pressure**. There are many different ways to say no to friends and peers when pressured to abuse alcohol, drugs, or tobacco. First, simply say "no" or "no thanks". Second, give a reason. For example, "I don't use drugs or alcohol". "I don't like the taste or the feelings when being under the influence." Next, offer an alternative.
