William (Bill) Kindred grew up in Morgan County and Elizabeth (Liz) lived in Waverly, IL. Bill attended Routt High School while Liz attended Sacred Heart Academy in Springfield, IL (now Sacred Heart-Griffin). The Kindred's were wed at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Franklin and went on to raise a family. Despite continuing to reside in Waverly, IL, Bill and Liz made the decision to send all three of their sons, Bill ('79), Steve ('83), and Joe ('88) to Routt, where all were extremely active with academics, athletics, and other extracurriculars. Bill and Liz were known as dedicated and loyal fans of the Rocket sports family and active members of the Church of Our Saviour. Bill was a loyal member of the Knights of Columbus and in her retirement years, Liz worked in the OSS-Routt cafeteria.

The William & Elizabeth Kindred Memorial Scholarship was initially created by Liz's husband and her three sons in 2018, and was revised after William's passing in 2019. The scholarship is specifically intended to support students who are willing to commute to Jacksonville in order to attend Routt Catholic. The scholarship will be distributed annually to a new or returning sophomore, junior, or senior who demonstrates financial need and resides outside the Jacksonville/South Jacksonville city limits.
